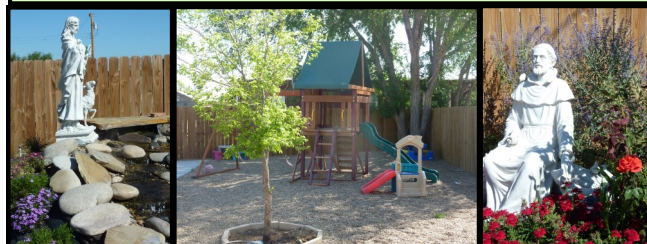

Our Mission

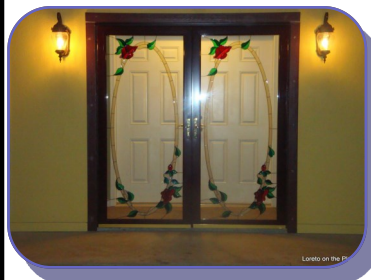

The Respect Life Rose Doors greet all who enter.

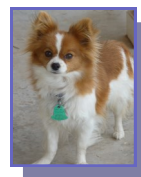
Types of Care at Loreto
